Medical Intensive Care Unit (ICU)

A Healing Hands donation from the Jayne Family Foundation recognizing the incredible care provided by the ICU team facilitated the attendance of ICU nurses at numerous national conferences, including the Society of Critical Care Nursing and the American Association of Critical-care Nurses National Teaching Institute. Such emphasis on continuing education allows ICU nurses to bring back the latest industry best practices and learnings to continue advancing care for patients at Morristown Medical Center. Donor funding also helped the unit to purchase recliners for patients to aid in the recovery process.




Gastroenterology (GI) Fellowship Program

This new, donor-funded clinical fellowship reflects Morristown Medical Center's commitment to providing the highest level of medical expertise and is essential to developing the top interventional GI program in the state.

The GI Fellowship will train future generations of physicians in advanced endoscopy, inflammatory bowel disease, hepatology, motility and general GI for emergency as well as inpatient and outpatient care.

In 2023, a generous contribution from Marsha and Jerrold Grossman helped set the stage for the program, and the Foundation for Morristown Medical Center continues to solicit funding for the salaries of six fellows.

Cardiology Fellowship Program

Led by Lillian Aldaia, MD, the Cardiology Fellowship Program at Gagnon Cardiovascular Institute provides intensive training in the full scope of cardiovascular medicine and spans a range of inherited and acquired cardiovascular diseases. Fellows are trained over three years in advanced imaging, electrophysiology, heart failure treatment and interventional cardiology. The Pester Family Fellow Endowment Fund helps to ensure the continued success of the program, and a generous gift in 2023 from The Sodhani Foundation will fully fund an additional fellow position.

Atlantic Precision Oncology Software

Atlantic Precision Oncology investigates genetic sequencing to improve cancer care. Philanthropy has helped to facilitate the purchase of specialized software that interfaces with electronic medical records and integrates genetic testing results into the clinical decision-making pathway, supplying evidence-based recommendations for treatment.



Breast Ultrasound

The Carol W. and Julius A. Rippel Breast Center was the first in the state to offer all-digital imaging and full tomosynthesis. Unprecedented growth, including 50,649 screenings in 2022, has created the need for additional imaging resources. Philanthropy from Lori and John Westerhold in 2023 will facilitate the purchase of an additional ultrasound machine to accommodate patient needs.

To honor the service of J. Peter Simon as a trustee of the Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation, the California-based foundation gave a generous \$1 million grant to launch the Beckman Advanced Cellular Therapy Unit at Morristown Medical Center.

Supporting leading-edge research embodies the mission of the Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation. Its investment in state-of-the-art treatments is a fitting tribute to Peter, who, as an Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation board member, collaborated on novel ways to give back to the scientific community that echoed the philosophy and lifelong calling of the late Arnold Beckman.

Beckman Advanced Cellular Therapy Unit

Completed in October 2023, the Beckman Advanced Cellular Therapy Unit at Morristown Medical Center provides highly specialized care for patients undergoing intensive chemotherapy or immunotherapy for the treatment of blood cancers. This patient population is particularly vulnerable to treatment-related side effects and requires heightened monitoring and management.

Hersh Fetal Diagnostic and Treatment Center (HFDTC)

The new Hersh Fetal Diagnostic and Treatment Center at Morristown Medical Center will provide a comprehensive program for pregnant women whose babies have congenital anomalies or other fetal complications. The HFDTC will offer coordinated access to multidisciplinary care by clinical experts whose sole focus is to keep both mother and baby healthy before, during and after birth. The new patient-centered facility at 55 Madison Avenue will centralize patient care services, expand diagnostic capabilities and create a welcoming and comforting patient care environment.

Philanthropy from donors such as the Gagnon Family Foundation, the Arthur M. Goldberg and Veronica Goldberg Foundation and the Dorothy B. Hersh Foundation is helping to move this vital initiative forward.

Donor Spotlight: The Dorothy B. Hersh Foundation



A \$2.5 million grant from the Dorothy B. Hersh Foundation, naming the Hersh Fetal Diagnostic and Treatment Center at Morristown Medical Center, will enable the hospital to elevate its state-of-theart treatments in maternal-fetal medicine exponentially over the next decade. The late Dorothy B. Hersh never married or had children of her own but was always interested in helping the underserved, those with disabilities and special needs youth in her community.

In her will, Dorothy made provisions that a foundation be established to provide a milk fund for orphans in Elizabeth, New Jersey, near where she spent most of her life. Upon her passing in 1979, the Dorothy B. Hersh Foundation was founded. As there were no longer orphanages or milk funds in New Jersey, the newly formed Foundation shifted its focus to children with special needs and those who are financially vulnerable.

Child Life Program

With charitable giving from donors in 2023, the Child Life Program at Goryeb Children's Hospital will be expanded to meet increasing patient volumes.

Certified Child Life specialists help young patients and their families cope with the stress and fear of acute and chronic illness, injury, trauma, disability, loss and bereavement.

Donor funding will add three positions to the Child Life team, including two certified Child Life specialists, a Child Life assistant and increased hours for the program's music therapist.

In 2023, the Juniors Fore Goryeb committee donated proceeds raised from their sixth annual golf outing to benefit Goryeb Children's Hospital's Pediatric Music Therapy Program. Although the event couldn't go on as planned due to smoke from the Canadian wildfires, these unstoppable teens still raised \$30,000!

Philanthropy has played a significant role in the incredible growth and popularity of the Calling All Kids Storytime Network at Goryeb Children's Hospital — the premier healing service of the Women's Association for Morristown Medical Center. By enabling new content and programs and helping pediatric patients find laughter and distraction with each other through creating television shows and other mixed media arts projects, children needing services at Goryeb Children's Hospital can find a way back to being kids again.

Sports Medicine Fellowship Program

Through the Somers Family Philanthropy, the Sports Medicine Fellowship Program expanded, providing a fourth fellowship position. The five-year program trains pediatricians and residents focusing on primary care physician education related to the proper diagnosis and treatment of youths with sports-related injuries in the Morristown community.

The Valerie Fund Children's Center

Established in 1999, the Valerie Fund Children's Center at Goryeb Children's Hospital provides personalized, comprehensive medical care to children and adolescents with cancer and blood disorders. With continued support from the nonprofit Valerie Fund, 2023 saw advances in the Child Life Program, integrative medicine, social work, mental health counseling and dietary assistance to help patients and families remain strong and resilient throughout their journey.

Fighting Children's Cancer Foundation Fund

The Fighting Children's Cancer Foundation supports families of patients at the Valerie Fund Children's Center by helping with the costs of transportation, mortgages, rent, utilities and related essential home expenses during the child's cancer treatment. The foundation also assists during the holidays so families can enjoy this special time despite the challenges of pediatric cancer and its treatment.

Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program

Seeded by more than \$2.24 million in donor contributions, the Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program at Morristown Medical Center trains the next generation of pediatric sub-specialists to care for our youngest and most vulnerable patients. This rigorous fellowship program includes three fellow positions – one for each training year. Over three years, fellows gain expertise and skills in clinical care, medical education and research. The first endowed Larry Skolnick NICU Fellow, Josephine Miller, MD, began her term in July 2023.



Last year, the Valerie Fund Children's Center was the beneficiary of Roxbury High School's annual Rox-THON, which raised more than \$41,000 to support patients at the center.

Low-dose Imaging System for Orthopedic Oncology

A generous grant from the Douglas M.
Noble Family Foundation will purchase
a low-dose imaging system that allows
patients to undergo diagnostic imaging
in less than 20 seconds, while remaining
standing. This innovative technology
will provide highly detailed images of
the spine, hips and legs and deliver
two to three times less radiation than a
computed X-ray and 20 times less than a
standard CT. Reducing radiation exposure
is critical, especially for children with
orthopedic cancer or spinal deformities
like scoliosis who receive numerous
X-rays to monitor disease progression.

The addition of this leading-edge technology will make Goryeb Children's Hospital and Morristown Medical Center one of few locations in the Tri-state area to make this low-dose imaging system available to patients.

Generous contributions from donors such as the Michael J. Kosloski Foundation support and advance orthopedic and orthopedic oncology initiatives at Morristown Medical Center. This includes helping to facilitate guest lecturers for the department, sponsoring publication submissions and supporting medical health and coaching for residents.

Christie Family Orthopedic Residency Program



Formally established in 2023 through a transformational donation from Kathy Christie, the first class of Christie Family Orthopedic Residents began their tenure in April of last year and are progressing through post-graduate year one. A comprehensive teaching schedule was instituted, with weekly didactic learning and conferences and visiting professor rotations. The first, Thomas Graham, MD, a world-renowned orthopedic hand surgeon, spent two days teaching the residents one-on-one. The second class of Christie Family Orthopedic Residents will start in July 2024.


Center of Excellence

The center cares for children, adolescents and adults who need short-term outpatient psychiatric treatment but do not require the services of an emergency department.






True North Veteran's Support Fund

Geriatric Medicine Center of Excellence Fund

With philanthropic support, the Geriatrics Center of Excellence, Morristown Medical Center has been designated a NICHE (Nurses Improving Care for Healthsystem Elders) hospital with "Exemplar" status and ranked by U.S. News & World Report as a top hospital nationwide for geriatrics. The medical center has dramatically increased geriatric medicine offerings and provides exceptional care for older adults in our community. Ongoing donor funding will be used to make strategic investments in continued education, training and new programs.

Geriatrics Fellowship Program

The donor-funded Geriatrics Fellowship Program at Morristown Medical Center is a comprehensive one-year program for physicians trained in internal or family medicine to gain expertise in assessing, treating and managing geriatric patients in all clinical settings — including office-based care, skilled nursing and long-term care facilities.

The program graduates one to two fellows each year. Since the program's formation in 2016, Atlantic Health System and Atlantic Medical Group have retained five of eight program graduates. The Geriatrics Fellowship Program also has the highest retention rate of graduates within the last five years of all Atlantic Health System's Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited training programs, and 100 percent of graduates have passed their geriatrics board exam to achieve board certification.


Center for Caregiver Training and Education

Earle Critical Care APN Fellowship Fund was established in 2021 to support the ongoing pursuit of patient-centered, quality care at Morristown Medical Center.

Created in 2023 with philanthropy from the Deskovick family, the program has hired four nurses with advanced degrees, each with respective clinical expertise in pediatrics, the pediatric emergency department, mother-baby and labor and delivery. This new team is working to create an immersive education model for student nurses during their clinical rotations and identify students interested in working at the hospital after graduation. At the same time, they help seasoned Morristown Medical Center nurses further develop their practice skills and, through this mentorship and collaboration, help to boost a sense of personal accomplishment while mitigating stress and emotional burnout.

Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) Fellowship

In addition, Morristown Medical Center also offers a comprehensive training program for Advanced Practice Practitioners (APPS) to learn and earn certification to perform bedside ultrasound for patient diagnosis and treatment.

Made possible by the generosity of the medical center's donor community, these APN fellows will obtain certification in Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS) and participate in a two-day hands-on course in March of 2024 to obtain competency in this skill. Past and current APN fellows will join to learn best practices when using ultrasound in the critical care setting.

A three-day APN Bootcamp will provide the APN fellows with the most up-to-date evidence-based guidelines needed to optimally care for the hospitalized patient. Content experts from across the organization will present various topics to the APNs. In addition, high-fidelity simulation will be used to practice and enhance decision-making skills in acute patient care situations.

WAMMC's Scholarship Program, which dates back to 1957, supports the staff at Morristown Medical Center by granting scholarships to hospital nurses and team members pursuing careers in the health care field. 

Fourth Stage of Pregnancy Program

Philanthropy remains essential in reducing health disparities.

Last year, donors such as the F. M. Kirby Foundation, Inc., Barbara and Bob Luciano and Kathy and Matt Sheeleigh supported a nurse navigator focused on the underserved maternity demographic within our communities. The navigator provides telehealth visits for the weeks and months after childbirth, which many health experts call the fourth trimester. This period has been earmarked as a time when new mothers have the least interaction with their health care team.

The Women's Association for Morristown Medical Center's 2024 Spring Fundraiser – Ode to Color – will also benefit this essential program.
