



Gagnon Institute of Bioskills Training and Innovation



The Gagnon Institute of Bioskills Training and Innovation offers physicians, nurses, medical students and other health professionals a safe and controlled environment to practice clinical skills without risk of patient harm. The current space located at 95 Madison Avenue is undergoing an expansion and modernization which includes a new, fully equipped mock operating room, an intensive care room, a new trauma resuscitation room and a standardized patient exam room.

As part of this donor-funded effort, highly advanced simulation manikins will be purchased, including a surgical skills manikin, a SimBaby™ manikin, an ultrasound simulator, central line simulators and other vital equipment.

Generous philanthropic support for this important effort comes from the Gagnon Family Foundation and Foundation for Morristown Medical Center Trustee Meghan Lyon and Richard Lyon.

Legacy Giving

With the support of our community, we exceeded our goal of 26 new Brookfield Legacy Society members and directed \$130,000 in unrestricted funds to an area of each donor's choice





Echocardiogram Machine

This essential diagnostic equipment helps identify a variety of cardiovascular conditions — from chest pain, dizziness and palpitations to tumors, heart valve leakage and heart anomalies.



Portable Telemetry Transport Monitors

These portable devices detect heartbeat patterns, identify issues and allow monitoring to continue when patients are transported to and from procedures.

Cardiovascular Rescue and Recovery Program

Atlantic Health System's Cardiovascular Rescue and Recovery Program at Morristown Medical Center expands the medical center's ability to provide 24/7/365 multidisciplinary support to our most critically ill heart patients, with access to worldrenowned specialists and life-saving treatments through Gagnon Cardiovascular Institute.

Established in September 2021 with donor support, and led by world-renowned interventional cardiologists Dimitri Karmpaliotis, MD, and Amirali Masoumi, MD, it is the first-and-only program of its kind in the state.

Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy (HCM)

Sudden cardiac arrest is often caused by HCM. HCM symptoms overlap with other medical ailments, making them difficult to diagnose and treat. Some patients experience shortness of breath, exercise intolerance, chest pressure and pain and fainting, while others experience no symptoms before sudden cardiac failure.

Thanks to donor support, including major gifts from Gar-Wood Burwell, Jonathan Dietz, and Jonathan and Stacey Seligson, advanced diagnostic care and treatment are available at the Chanin T. Mast Center for Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy at Gagnon Cardiovascular Institute – the only dedicated HCM program in the state and one of only two on the East Coast.

Advanced Cellular Therapy Unit

Construction will begin on the new 10-bed unit in mid-2023 and will expand Morristown Medical Center's ability to care for high-acuity patients undergoing immune effector cell treatments – most commonly CAR-T. This will be vital as Carol G. Simon Cancer Center increases the number of immune effector therapy cases, introduces new cellular therapies and enrolls more patients in clinical trials through our partnership with the Translational Genomics Research Institute. Generous support for this important project includes the Healey Family Foundation, Foundation Trustee Kathleen Ross and Amo Ross and Robert C. and Natalie Rooke.

Hematology-Oncology Fellowship Program

With the launch of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)-accredited Hematology-Oncology Fellowship Program in 2020, Morristown Medical Center reaffirmed its commitment to attracting the nation's best physicians to Carol G. Simon Cancer Center by providing specialized training to the top oncologists in the field of medicine today. As a result of generous support from donors such as the Estate of Warren R. Neil Jr., the program's first fellow, Nicole Burak, MD, was chosen from a rigorous pool of more than 175 applicants and began her three-year training in July 2021. She was joined by Brian S. Baksa, MD, in July 2022.

Cancer Investigator Development Fund

Infusion Center Fund

GE Venue Fit[™] + Vscan Ultrasound

Ultrasounds are a safe, radiation-free way to evaluate and identify the exact location of muscles, nerves, arteries and glands. In children who need treatment for tight, painful muscles that prevent movement, ultrasound guidance is invaluable to preventing pain and potential complications.



Pediatric Vein Viewer

Thanks to generous contributions from donors such as the Ausiello Family, a pediatric vein viewer system was purchased for the Gagnon Children's Emergency Department to help provide an accurate image of patients' veins.



Stealth Autoquide™ Robot

The first of its kind in the state, the Stealth Autoguide™ robotic guidance system allows surgeons to efficiently place multiple electrodes into the brain for seizure monitoring stereotactically, without the need for surgery. In 2022, specialists at the Epilepsy Center performed six surgeries utilizing this groundbreaking technology.

Donor Spotlight: The Valerie Fund



On September 17, 2022, more than 1,200 walkers, 250 runners and 150 volunteers took part in the 17th Annual Valerie Fund Walk/Run presented by Valerie Fund Founders Ed and Sue Goldstein and JAG-ONE Physical Therapy. The event raised more than \$828,000 to support these long-time philanthropic partners. As a part of their #BetterTogether initiative, CBS News produced a moving segment highlighting the physicians and care teams who work with pediatric cancer patients and their families each day at the Valerie Fund Children's Center at Goryeb Children's Hospital.

Pediatric Hematology-Oncology

Good Neighbor Fund

A key component of the mission for family-centered care at Goryeb Children's Hospital, the Good Neighbor Fund uses donor gifts to support families with daily living expenses, gas and electric bills, childcare costs, mortgage or rent payments and pharmaceutical purchases. Last year, Roxbury High School students contributed more than \$37,000 to support Goryeb Children's Hospital and the Good Neighbor Fund through the annual Rox-THON.

Pediatric Hematology-Oncology Nurse Navigator

In 2022, funds raised through the Fifth Annual Juniors Fore Goryeb Golf Outing and generous support from the Valerie Fund helped create a Pediatric Hematology-Oncology Nurse Navigator position. Ashley Mariconda, RN, was hired to fill the role in late 2022 and will serve as a central point of contact for patients and their families, guiding them through the continuum of cancer care - from diagnosis to treatment and follow-up care.

Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program

Morristown Medical Center's youngest and most vulnerable patients receive extraordinary care at Sam's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) under the supervision of 14 neonatologists.

To train the next generation of experts in this field, the Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program will equip fellows in pediatric clinical care, medical education and research.

This program is seeded entirely through philanthropy, and the first endowed Larry Skolnick NICU Fellow, Josephine Miller, MD, began her term in July 2023. Generous support in 2022 came from the F. M. Kirby Foundation, Inc. and the Caruso Family Foundation, whose matching challenge raised more than \$100,000 for the fellowship program.

Atlantic Fetal Diagnostic and Treatment Center (AFDTC)

The AFDTC gives women with high-risk pregnancies vital access to experts whose sole focus is to keep both mother and baby healthy before, during and after birth. To bring this program to the next level, women with highrisk pregnancies will soon be able to receive seamless care in one location — ideally during one appointment. A new full-time perinatal care coordinator will serve as a family-physician liaison and help parents navigate the complexities of their care. In keeping with Goryeb Children's Hospital's commitment to both the physical and emotional aspects of patient care, the AFDTC will ensure that families have 24/7 access to Goryeb Children's Hospital experts for continuous patientand family-centered care.

Generous contributors to this project include the Gagnon Family Foundation and the Arthur M. Goldberg and Veronica Goldberg Foundation.

Pediatric Neurology/Epilepsy

The Epilepsy Center team at Goryeb Children's Hospital incorporates a comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach to treat pediatric patients suffering from this complex neurological condition. Through support from donors such as the Martire and Velez families and the Louise Washington Charitable Trust, the center has begun a five-year development plan for growth in treating pediatric epilepsy. This includes the addition of support positions; state-of-the-art equipment upgrades like the Stealth Autoguide™ robotic guidance system and facility upgrades. The donor-funded Epilepsy Nurse Navigator position has also been filled, with Kiera Warren, RN, starting in late 2022.

Child Life Program

Child Life Specialists do their best to keep pediatric patients educated, entertained and distracted at the bedside. With donor support, they are able to purchase supplies – such as stress balls, playing cards, crayons and craft items, educational toys, games and Xboxes – that provide many hours of much-needed fun and entertainment

In 2022, the Barer Family Foundation funded an additional Child Life Specialist position in pediatric surgery. This dedicated resource will focus on preparing children and parents before a procedure and offer support day of. Research shows that children who are psychologically prepared for surgery experience fewer negative symptoms, have less post-traumatic stress, lower levels of fear and anxiety, increased cooperative behaviors and better long-term adjustment to future medical challenges.

Farris Family Center for Advanced Medicine in Pediatrics (CAMP)

A generous donation from Christopher and Linda Baldwin supported funding needs at CAMP including new outdoor furniture for Kayla's Healing Garden.

The upgrade will support children and their families who use the tranquil space as an important outdoor respite. Funds will also be used to purchase upgraded infusion recliners for pediatric patients, high-back chairs for parents and new gaming systems for the young patients receiving care at CAMP.

Pediatric Sepsis Program

Thanks to the generosity of the R Baby Foundation, Goryeb Children's Hospital has made incredible inroads in treating pediatric sepsis and using simulation technology for clinical training. Caused by a bacterial, viral or fungal infection, early detection and aggressive treatment of sepsis is crucial. The R Baby Foundation has made it possible for Goryeb Children's Hospital to institute a hospitalwide pediatric sepsis recognition protocol to improve patient outcomes.



Patient Support Fund

Gifts from donors such as the Larini Foundation help the Patient Support Fund assist parents and caregivers of patients at Goryeb Children's Hospital in dire financial need. Advanced CT Scanner

The installation of a new, advanced CT scanner, made possible by a \$2.5 million donation from the Margaret A. Darrin Charitable Trust.



Trauma Elevator Expansion

The extension of all four of the Emergency Department's trauma elevators to the medical center's rooftop to expedite access to and from the helipad during a trauma emergency. Made possible by a generous grant from the Ann K. Kirby Foundation.



Patient Monitor Upgrades

Enhanced and expanded patient monitoring to track arrhythmias, temperature, blood pressure, pulse oxygen and more.



Relocation and Expansion

Relocation of the Pediatric Day Hospital and Sleep Center to the second floor of Goryeb Children's Hospital to make way for the new 17-room Gagnon Children's Emergency Department, which will be built on the first floor of Goryeb Children's Hospital.

Planning for the overall expansion and modernization of the Sameth Emergency Department is in progress, with completion projected at the end of 2024.



Donor Spotlight: Kathleen E. "Kathy" Christie

Kathy Christie is building an unforgettable legacy at Morristown Medical Center through her passion for philanthropy and volunteerism. She watched her late parents, Stuart and Shelia Christie, give to their community so selflessly and generously that it has become second nature.

"My parents taught my siblings and me about giving back to our community, and it was not only money; they gave of themselves in so many different ways," said Kathy. Her transformative gift – one of the most significant in the history of the Foundation for Morristown Medical Center – will establish a comprehensive medical education program that includes the Christie Family Orthopedic Residency Program and a one-year fellowship training program, the Christie Family Orthopedic Fellowship Program, that will offer an advanced orthopedic curriculum in a collaborative clinical environment.

Christie Family Orthopedic Residency and Fellowship Programs

The creation of the Christie Family Orthopedic Residency and Fellowship Programs is an essential step in the hospital's development as a world-class orthopedic center. In New Jersey, a mere nine accredited orthopedic residency programs exist, and only 154 are available across the nation. Of the top 50 orthopedic centers in the United States, all 50 have a robust orthopedic fellowship program.

These critical continuing-education initiatives enable the hospital to build a funnel of new surgeons trained to the highest standards who can help meet growing patient demand. The residency and fellowship programs also benefit the hospital's research efforts and elevate its regional and national profile, as the orthopedic department seeks the best and the brightest surgical talent to train and practice at Morristown Medical Center and Atlantic Health System.

Made possible by the incredible generosity of Kathy Christie, president of the Women's Association for Morristown Medical Center (October 2021 - June 2023) and Washington Partner*, the Christie Family Orthopedic Residency Program received ACGME accreditation in April and its first four residents began in July 2023. The Christie Family Orthopedic Fellowship is in active recruitment for its first two fellows, who will begin their one-year tenure during the 2024 academic year.

Collaborative Care

In a collaborative care model, patients' problems are no longer dichotomized into physical and mental states. Integrating both disciplines into a comprehensive, cohesive treatment approach helps ensure that a person's total health is addressed.

This approach helps to close the care gap for undiagnosed mental health cases in primary care settings, giving patients of all ages vital access to quality mental health care and improving patient outcomes and overall quality of life.

With donor support, Atlantic Behavioral Health at Morristown Medical Center has implemented this groundbreaking care model and services are currently available in five adult primary care practices, two subspecialty practices and two pediatric practices of Atlantic Medical Group.

Behavioral Health Assessment Center

Generous gifts from donors including the Gagnon Family Foundation and Ryan Family Foundation will support staffing for the new Behavioral Health Assessment Center at Morristown Medical Center

The Assessment Center will serve as an "urgent care" facility for children, adolescents and adults who need short-term outpatient psychiatric treatment but do not require the services of an emergency department.

Peer Recovery Program

Adult patients who seek to live free of alcohol, drugs, addiction and mental health illness receive support for these behavioral challenges not only from paid hospital staff but also from approved volunteers in the Peer Recovery Program. Trained and certified Peer Recovery Support Specialists share tools, skills and information that help transform the lives of those in need. In turn, they find that their recovery and well-being benefit from helping others.

With support from donors such as the Bisaccia Family and Ken and Carol Silbert, members of Morristown Medical Center's clinical team introduce these support specialists to patients at their hospital bedside to discuss their recovery plan.



True North Behavioral Health for Veterans

Atlantic Health System's True North initiative provides mental health outreach services for at-risk veterans living in northern New Jersey. Established in 2017 and made possible by support from donors such as the Nicholas J. and Anna K. Bouras Foundation, this unique care program combines behavioral health interventions and other therapies to assess, treat and support the psychosocial needs of veterans living in our communities.

True North's mission is to serve the men and women who courageously served us by putting them on the path to better mental health.

Hospital Elder Life Program (HELP)

Delirium is characterized by profound confusion, inattention and functional decline in older hospitalized patients. Delirium can be prevented or reduced through HELP, which provides bedside interventions to keep this patient population mentally and functionally engaged. A generous seed grant from the Marion E. C. Walls Trust implemented HELP at Morristown Medical Center and the trust continues to support the program today.

Geriatrics Fellowship Program

The donor-funded Geriatrics Fellowship Program at Morristown Medical Center is a comprehensive one-year training for physicians trained in internal or family medicine to gain expertise in the assessment, treatment and management of geriatric patients in all clinical settings — including office-based care, skilled nursing and long-term care facilities.

The program graduates one to two fellows each year. Since the program's formation in 2016, Atlantic Health System has retained three fellows as geriatricians.



Inpatient Hospice and Palliative Care

Thanks in part to donor support, patients can receive palliative care services not only at the Nancy and Skippy Weinstein Inpatient Hospice and Palliative Care Center at Morristown Medical Center but also throughout the hospital's various inpatient units. The palliative care team works closely with each patient's primary care physician to integrate supportive care into their treatment plan.

To demonstrate the hospital's commitment to this medical specialty and to improving patients' quality of life, Morristown Medical Center also operates a robust outpatient palliative care service and palliative care learning collaborative to educate clinical staff.

Fund for Excellence in Nursing

The donor-supported Fund for Excellence in Nursing makes it possible for Morristown Medical Center's dedicated nursing team to participate in activities that foster resiliency, empowerment, engagement and development.

Last year, funding helped underwrite fun and engaging events centered around Nurses Week in May, recognition for nursing team members and staff development. A bequest from the Estate of Barbara and Norman Tomlinson also helped support nurse manager professional development classes.

Hire Learning Residency Program

The donor-funded Hire Learning Residency Program at Morristown Medical Center provides a structured environment in which new nurses work alongside an experienced nurse preceptor to gain hands-on experience in clinical decisionmaking and skills development. The result is better patient care and a stronger, more empowered and more resilient nurse workforce. It also helps prevent staffing shortages by reducing new graduate turnover.

Morristown Medical Center is working to enroll 80 new nursing school graduates. Each will be assigned a nurse preceptor and longer-term mentor who will support professional role guidance as new nurses transition into practice.





Dexter D. Earle Critical Care Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) Fellowship Fund

Earle Critical Care APN Fellowship Fund was established in 2021 to support the ongoing pursuit of patient-centered, quality care at Morristown Medical Center.

Studies have shown that APNs in critical care are key members of a multidisciplinary team. They enhance the efficiency of a patient's flow throughout a hospital stay; support communication between disciplines and between patients and families; assist in developing individualized care plans; and provide a holistic approach to ensure that patients' medical, physical, emotional and spiritual needs are met. In 2022, Program Manager Jodi Galesi, DNP, RN, joined the team, and three cohorts have successfully begun their 12-month programs.

Center for Nursing Innovation and Research (CNIR)

With the help of Morristown Medical Center's donor community, the CNIR has several ongoing initiatives aimed at improving patient outcomes. One example is the Evidence-based Practice Scholars Program. Managed by visiting professor Katherine Hinic, PhD, clinical nurses participate in this year-long program to learn how to assess published literature and identify best practices for patients. Graduates of the program have presented at local, regional and national conferences

In 2022, the center launched an Innovation and Design Thinking WorkShop to teach 10 nurses the process of innovation. Nurses came prepared with a clinical challenge and learned how to understand the perspectives of end users, prototype ideas, brainstorm and overcome barriers to move innovative solutions forward
